Kalida High School Anatomy and Human Body Systems students attend Healthcare Futures Day at Mercy Health St. Rita's. On Oct. 5th, thirty-seven students participated in an event at the Graduate Medical Education Center on the campus of St. Rita's. Students visited five different stations during the event. They worked on High Fidelity Patient Simulators, alongside physicians, while a variety of cardiovascular conditions were simulated. Another station allowed students to learn about the uses of ultrasound technologies and gave one KHS student a hands on experience using an ultrasound to view the bladder of a patient volunteer. Other hands on learning experiences during this event included suturing, visiting the Advanced Anatomy Lab and explore diseased pathology lab samples. During the day, Kalida students had opportunities to talk with medical profes-

sionals about education required, job responsibilities and other topics related to health and medical careers.
