### From our Superintendent

I would like to thank the community of Kalida for the warm reception that my family and I have received since I became superintendent. I am very impressed by the quality of the students, staff, and the administration here at Kalida. My family and I are looking forward to becoming part of the community. I also would like to thank Mr. Williams for his assistance during the transition in leadership. He is truly a professional in every sense of the word.

The building project is moving along nicely and I am currently focusing on 'getting up to speed' in terms of phase one of the project. Until recently, the weather has been cooperative and the project is for the most part on schedule. The shell is approximately 75% under cover. The next short-term goal is to button up the building in order to make it possible to efficiently heat the structure.

One of the most important and challenging responsibilities for school leaders is maintaining their school district's fiscal health. Typically, school districts that are able to maintain a solid financial position are those that follow a consistent set of conservative, common sense financial management strategies. Like most every other public school in Ohio, Kalida has some serious financial considerations looming on the horizon. The 'flat' funding from the state in conjunction with rising expenses makes it quite challenging to manage district finances. Another factor that figures into the funding equation is enrollment. Our preliminary kindergarten numbers for next school year are surprisingly low and this may eventually need to be addressed. The school board and administration are definitely not 'asleep at the wheel.' We are fully aware of the financial situation and will make every effort to be fiscally responsible without sacrificing any of the fine academic, arts, or athletic programs.

## **IMPORTANT REMINDER FOR JUNIORS (AND YOUNGER STUDENTS)**

ACT tests have a new wrinkle beginning this February. An optional writing portion will be added to the existing four part ACT test. It would almost be simpler if the writing portion were required because some colleges are requiring the writing test and others are recommending—and the list has already changed several times.

Unsure about whether to take the writing test? Listed below are colleges that require or recommend the new writing part of the ACT test:

Looking at last year's senior class as an example, one third of those students made final choices of colleges that will now require the writing test. For this year's juniors and students in lower grades, it would be very wise to take the extra writing portion just to be safe and to have more options in making college choices.

**NOTE:** This year's seniors do NOT have to take the writing test portion of the ACT.

## **FOR PARENTS OF SENIORS—FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION**

If you will be filing the FAFSA (financial aid application) this year, you can get extra help in a variety of ways.

First, on Monday, January 17, a financial aid presentation sponsored by Ottoville, Fort Jennings, Kalida, and Continental will be held at 7 PM in the Ottoville High School Auditoria. Mr. Lawrence Matthews of Bluffton University will explain the financial aid application process. Mr. Matthews is the president of the Ohio Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators—in other words, one of the most knowledgeable people in the field. Plan to allow about 90 minutes for this session. All of our seniors will receive a packet of information in financial aid. It will be helpful (but not required) to bring this packet along.

Second, on February 13, 2005, College Goal Sunday is being held all across the state at over 30 sites. These are hands-on sessions doing the actual FAFSA application. You will need to bring both parents' and students' 2004 IRS 1040 tax returns and W2s along with other 2004 income and benefits information. Everything else will be provided. The closest sites for Kalida parents are at Lima Senior High School and the University of Findlay. Walk-ins will be welcome, but it is best to register ahead of time. **Registration will begin after January 2 at [www.oasfaa.org](http://www.oasfaa.org).**

More suggestions—consider doing the FAFSA online. It is a faster process and has some nice features built-in that can help spot innocent errors and help save six weeks of processing time. All of the seniors will be given a “paper” application as well that can be used as a guideline for assembling the required information. To save even more time, get a PIN (Personal Identification Number) ahead of time. The PIN will allow you to “sign” your FAFSA electronically. That saves you the processing time that would be taken up by having to print out a page for your signatures and mailing the page in. Pins can be obtained at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov) or use the handy link on the high school and guidance pages of the school website. **Both a parent and the student need separate PINS for this process.**

Another concern—there are several FAFSA websites on the internet which will charge you for doing the application. Be sure you use [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) when applying online. That website is the official one sanctioned by the government and it is free.
