- I hope this issue of the Paw Print finds residents rested and ready to begin the New Year. We are very close to reaching the halfway point of the school year and much of our focus has shifted to planning for next year. I am very happy to announce that we will be expanding our Project Lead the Way curriculum to include *BioMedical Education* next school year along with our existing *Pre-Engineering Program*. The details have not yet been finalized, but it is very likely that we will also be offering dual-enrollment courses next year as well for students who would like to earn college credit and high school credit simultaneously. Hopefully, the details of these courses will be finalized by next month's newsletter. It is quite exciting to be able to offer these opportunities to our students!
- The 2008-09 school calendar was adopted by the Board of Education at the January meeting and can be viewed (pg.4) in this month's newsletter. This information is also available on the district web site. In other board business, Dennis Turnwald was elected Board President and Brian Laudick Vice President. Congratulations also to Mr. Laudick as he was elected President of the Vantage School Board at their organizational meeting.
- There have not been any significant developments pertaining to the upcoming construction project, as we are still waiting on the final approval from the Toledo Diocese on the lease/purchase that was agreed to locally by the Board of Education, the Parish Council, and St. Michael's Church Finance Committee. Hopefully, this issue will be resolved quickly and we can move forward on the project. Monthly meetings are being held with the Ohio School Facilities Commission as we continue to move forward on the completion of our facilities.
- Currently, we have 38 students who plan to enroll in kindergarten next school year. This is significantly less than last year's kindergarten class and will require one less section of kindergarten. Parents may still have their children screened and enrolled for next school year if they have not yet done so.

Financial Aid Night for Senior Parents/Students

The FAFSA or Free Application For Student Assistance is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parent(s) in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds that the respective schools distribute. Paper applications will be available in December, but applying online for the FAFSA is faster and more accurate. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at **www.fafsa.ed.gov** What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent need a pin. You can obtain this at www.pin.ed.gov

Every year a seminar is held at one of the following area participating schools: Continental, Kalida, Ft. Jennings, and Ottoville. It is, thus, rotated yearly among the four schools. This year it will be held on Monday, January 21 from 7 – 9 PM at Continental High School. A representative from a local college's financial aid department will be present to explain various types of financial aid that students may have the potential to obtain. In addition, he will explain the proper procedure for filling out the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA). Parents of Juniors are also encouraged to attend if they wish to get a head start on the college process.
