There is a lot of exciting information to share with residents in this month's newsletter. In the near future, Residents will be receiving a mailing from current School Board President, Barry von der Embse regarding the master plan for our upcoming building project.

Curricular Changes – In addition to this project, there have been several curricular changes in the last two years that are worth noting. A conscious effort has been made by the board of education and our entire staff at Kalida to ratchet up our list of course offerings and opportunities for our students. Some of the new opportunities that have been offered to our students include technology and keyboarding classes at the elementary level, Advanced Placement English and Government courses at the high school level, the opportunity for several eighth grade students to take Algebra I for high school credit, and the ability to obtain physical education credits for participating in extracurricular athletics and marching band. Additionally, the district applied for and was awarded a \$20,000 grant to begin a *Project Lead the Way Pre-Engineering Program* for students who are interested in getting a jumpstart on a four year engineering degree while still in high school. Additional Advanced Placement and Project Lead the Way courses are being considered for the future.

School Bus Fleet Changes – Residents may have noticed several different school busses around the bus garage over the summer. The district purchased three used school busses to replace three of the busses in our current fleet that a have a combined 650,000 miles on them. The newer busses have a larger seating capacity, newer safety features, and a lot less miles on the odometer. These three busses were purchased for a combined price of roughly \$45,000. The price of one brand new bus was quoted to the district at \$72,500. The State of Ohio only pays for a fraction of the cost of replacing worn out school busses, and the last two years the district has received less than \$3000 per school year to maintain our fleet. We will be selling two of the busses that were just replaced at public auction. Any resident who is interested in bidding on them should contact the superintendent's office for details.

*Opening Enrollment* – As of the first day of school 341 students are enrolled in the elementary and 300 in the high school. We have 24 students attending Vantage in the junior and senior high classes. The current kindergarten enrollment is at 51 students. The class of 2008, seniors, has 47 students.



#### **Red Cross Donation Site**

Kalida Residents Tricia and Greg Klausing organized a local Red Cross donation site at the KHS parking lot on Wednesday, August 29. Thanks to the great response of the community, the band trailer was soon filled to capacity. In addition, over \$5000 in monetary donations were collected for the Putnam County flood victims.

On my third day as a Red Cross volunteer I suffered a complete meltdown over a package of diapers! I was assigned to greet flood victims as they arrived. A solemn young couple with two children stopped by the table as they were leaving to say "thank you." Their home is located near the Blanchard River and suffered tremendous damage. When I asked if there was anything else the Red Cross could do for them they told me what they really needed were diapers and formula. I had to tell them we didn't have any at that time. It was heart wrenching to think that a family who had just lost their home and all their possessions could not get the most basic of needs for their children.

I left my stressful post and stepped outside. But crying was not going to solve the problem, so I called Kalida, the Jeremy Stober family specifically. Putnam County is known for extending generous aid to its neighbors. I knew that if asked the Kalida community would surely respond. Christi and Jeremy Stober rallied the Kalida community and within the hour they called to let me know they had a shipment of diapers on the way with a promise for more. I was able to send that young family three packages of diapers yet that evening!

An even bigger surprise awaited me that night. The Kalida High School volleyball team brought me to tears once again when they called to say they had collected over \$1500 in just two hours! The cash plus all the donations of diapers and cleaning supplies have been a tremendous help for the flood victims. Please accept a sincere thank you expressed to everyone in the Kalida community who has helped in some way with the flood relief. The recovery process will likely continue for some time. It is comforting to know help is only a phone call away.

Added Note: The Kalida Volleyball team would like to also express their thanks to all those who helped them in this cause. Your donations were greatly needed and appreciated.

#### **Guidance Notes**

The school year is off to a great start. Several activities have already been scheduled for high school students in the upcoming weeks. Information will be shared first with seniors since this is their last year in the halls of Kalida High School as they prepare to transition into more advanced education or employment opportunities. Two days were spent with seniors and information relative to college and scholarship preparation was presented to them.

**SENIORS** will be participating in a **Financial Awareness Day** sponsored by Superior Credit Union at the OSU-Lima/James A. Rhodes State College campus on Monday, September 17.

**JUNIORS** will be attending a **college fair** in Defiance on Wednesday, September 25 in an effort to spark their interest in the college process. Also, several college representatives will be visiting Kalida High School and holding informational sessions of which both juniors and seniors will have the opportunity to attend.

Two assessments have been scheduled this fall that will help to prepare students for college. The PSAT has been slated for Wednesday, October 17 for juniors and sophomores who register while the PLAN (pre-ACT) has been set for Tuesday, December 4 for sophomores. The cost for the PLAN is \$9.

#### PSAT TESTING FOR SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS

On Wednesday, October 17, sophomores and juniors can participate in the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test, commonly referred to as the PSAT. Participating in the test is required if students wish to be considered for the National Merit Scholarship Competition. Also, many employment locations use the test as a criteria for employees' children. Students were given a booklet at school about the test and a listing of companies that use the test was included in it.

According to guidelines set forth by the governing body for the competition, only juniors who take the test are eligible for scholarship consideration. Sophomores would be taking it for practice and the experience. Any sophomore who takes the test would, therefore, have to take it again as a junior. Also, the PSAT is a good experience for students who will later take the SAT and/ or ACT, the assessments required for college entrance. The cost of the test is \$13 and students can register through Friday, September 21.

These are just a couple of the many activities that will take place with students over the next several months.
