Mr. Williams has been employed by the school district since1970.

Progress continues to take place in the construction of the new building. The weather has cooperated and remained suitable for construction and there have been no major delays in the delivery of materials.

I am often asked what would have happened if we had waited to build until state money was available under the Classroom Facilities Assistance Program (CFAP) instead of building the discreet portion with all local funds under the Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP.) I am so glad that the district residents voted to approve the project in November, 2002. If this project were approved this year, the district's share would be \$3 million more!

Hopefully, Phase II, the completion of the Junior-Senior High School building and the construction of an elementary building with state funding will be completed in the near future. - Robert Williams, Superintendent

What is a Five-Year Forecast?

The 5-year forecast reflects three years of general fund historical revenues and expenditures, as well as a forecast of the current fiscal year and four additional fiscal years. It is a good planning tool and does change as updated information becomes available. The forecast is a painting of the future, based upon a snap shot of today.

Our fiscal condition, while currently good, will not remain so indefinitely. In 1994, the Ohio Supreme Court declared Ohio's system for school funding unconstitutional. After 10 years of lawsuits, the legislature still has not "fixed" the system. We continue to struggle with a system that relies heavily on local property taxes. With the current funding system Kalida will eventually need to ask for additional local revenue and/or reduce the quality of the educational programs offered to students. We pledge to keep you informed as to the financial status of our school and be prudent in our expenditures.
