**Kalida High School receives Bronze Medal!** - Congratulations to the students and staff at Kalida High School for receiving a bronze medal from U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT. Kalida High School was recognized on their second annual list of America's Best High Schools.

America's Best High School's recognizes schools based on standardized test performance, proficiency rates of all students and challenging college-ready curriculum. This award is a credit to all of the hard work our students and staff put in on a daily basis. This award is a reflection of the commitment from our staff as they continually look for cutting edge curriculum and programming. This award is also a result of the excellent instruction our students receive at all grade levels K-12 and the commitment to educational excellence from our parents and community.

**Elementary Levy Update** - The district will be on the ballot on February 3, 2009. The ballot language has been approved and we will be asking district residents to approve a bond issue to construct a new elementary building.

We are continuing to meet with local groups and organizations to discuss the elementary construction project and levy issue. At these meetings we have discussed the history of this issue and distributed the proposed floor plan of the new elementary building. The elementary building plan addresses our changing enrollment, curriculum needs, and programming. The building plan insert shows the new academic wing of the elementary in bold over the outline of the current St. Michael's building.

The February levy will allow the district to use money received as a credit from the Ohio School Facilities Commission to construct a new elementary building. We are simply asking the voters for permission to use money already approved in 2002 to finish the original building master plan. We are in the process of scheduling community meetings in January to update the district residents on the levy and answer any questions people may have regarding this issue.

We are also still working on a legislative and Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC) solution to this issue. We have sent another round of letters to Senator Steve Buehrer and Representative Lynn Wachtmann, but unfortunately we received word on Friday, December 5, that the OSFC would not be able to help the district out in this situation. We have not heard back from Mr. Buehrer or Mr. Wachtmann regarding the latest letters we have sent to them.

**High School Construction Update-** The high school building project continues to progress very nicely. The weather has not been as nice to our contractors as it was during the fall, but they are still working hard to keep the project ahead of schedule. The exterior envelope of the building is almost complete and the contractors are weather proofing the building so work can continue through the winter. They have started to pour the floors inside the two-story portion of the building, have almost completed the roof installation on this portion of the building and almost have the vocational agriculture and industrial technology shop areas under roof. We will continue to update the construction photos area of the website so you can check on the progress. ~ Don Horstman, Superintendent

#### Juniors: Don't Forget the ACT!!

Parents of juniors are encouraged to remind their students to register and take the ACT at least 2 - 3 times before their senior year. The ACT is one of the two college entrance exams – the other being the SAT - required by most schools for admission. The ACT is the more dominant of the two for schools in Ohio and the Midwest. Colleges will accept either test. The ACT is offered 5 times a year - next year 6 as Ohio will be adding a test for September. Remaining tests for this school year are in February, April, and June. The deadline to register for the test in February is Jan. 6th. Students can pick up packets in the guidance office or register online at www. actstudent.org.

## Seniors: Don't Forget the FAFSA!!

Parents of seniors who will be attending college next fall are reminded to complete the Free Application for Student Assistance (FAFSA). The FAFSA is the governmental form which must be filled out by the student and his/her parent(s) in order to determine the student's eligibility for financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require that it be filled out if a student wishes to be considered for funds or scholarships that the respective schools distribute. Beginning January 1 for this year's seniors, parents and students can access the application at www.fafsa.ed.gov

What can you do right now? Parents and students can apply for a pin number which will be your electronic signature for the FAFSA. The student and at least one parent need a pin. You can obtain this at www.pin.ed.gov A good goal for completion of the FAFSA is mid-February. Most schools have certain deadlines for completion of the FAFSA - some as early as the end of February.

## Freshmen To Do Career Exploration

During January, freshmen will be doing career research with Mrs. Mary Gerding, and myself, in their English classes for a period. During this time, students will examine their own personalities and the relationship of these traits with potential careers. As part of the activities, students will take personality and career assessments to isolate an occupation upon which they will do research using ECOS – a college and career computer program.

**PSAT Results -** Results have arrived for the PSAT which many juniors and a few sophomores took in October. These results will be shared with students on Wednesday, December 17.

**ASVAB-**All sophomores will be taking the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test on Jan. 13. This test is an excellent assessment tool that helps to isolate a student's strengths for possible career choices. The ASVAB is also used by all US military branches as an entrance exam. If a student becomes interested in the military as a junior or senior, he ,or she, would have to take the ASVAB again in order to enlist.
